

We also collected 452 pounds of TrueNorth's "most needed" food items for their pantry as a service project! -KM


## WyldLife


A key component to Cadets is the relationship between the boys and their counselors. We are thankful for the leaders who faithfully meet with the boys, teaching them both faith and life lessons.
