

OUR NEW VISION STATEMENT

"Imperfect people growing with our community in love for God and each other."

Since the beginning of 2019, we have been rolling out our new vision statement. Developing a new vision statement was one of our major assignments in our Ignite renewal process. After spending a year listening to God, to each other and to our community, the Ignite Team put together the statement above. Council approved the new statement and you've likely seen it on the bulletin, on our website, on our Facebook page, and now, on the west wall of the Narthex, under the stained glass window.



The danger with vision statements is that they have a tendency to exist only on paper (or on the wall!). It's our goal that we live into this statement and make it not just something we say, but something we do.

In this issue and the next, we will look at the vision statement in small chunks and explore what God is calling us to be and to do.

"Imperfect people..."

We want to be clear that being part of a church does not mean that you have your act together. Sometimes we can make it seem that way but when we peel away the layers, it becomes clear that none of us has "arrived," either as people or as followers of Jesus.

It's not coincidental that the 12 disciples are often portrayed in Scripture as not getting it and not coming from the best pedigree. Matthew was a tax collector. Peter was a

zealot (a rebel against the Roman government) as well as a fisherman. Jesus was from Nazareth, which prompted the disciple Nathanael to say, "Nazareth! Can anything good come from there?" The 12 disciples didn't get it; they were imperfect people.

But that doesn't mean that imperfect people can't be used by God. Look at what the disciples did as they were empowered by the Holy Spirit and began a movement that we know as the early church. Similarly, even though we are 21st century imperfect people, the Holy Spirit empowers us to love and serve God and our neighbor; to share the good news of salvation through Jesus Christ. In our imperfection, we are perfected by Christ through his sacrifice on the cross and filled with the Holy Spirit.

"...growing with our community..."

Every vision statement needs a verb and our verb is "growing." Life as a follower of Jesus is all about growing, no matter our age and no matter how long we've been following Jesus. There are so many ways to grow: worship, small groups, Core classes, Children in worship, Bible studies, youth groups, etc. It's been said that if you're not growing, you're dying. That's especially true in the Christian life. It's our vision that every person in our congregation and every person that God sends to us will be growing in their faith.

But we grow in and with community. God created us to live and learn and grow in community. When we listen to others, we're given the gift of other perspectives that help shape our own understanding. Growing in community means that we see each other as God's gifts to us.

We also grow with the community, meaning that we want to reach out to our community, inviting them into a relationship with Jesus Christ. We believe that God has placed us here for a reason: to be a blessing to our community. As we grow in our faith, we want the community of Fremont to be growing with us. We want all that we do to be open and accessible to our community. We're thankful for the opportunities we've had to host community concerts and other events and look forward to how we will continue to make connections with our community.


Reaching the World with the Living Hope

this country became known. And how many of our friends and supporters no nothing about the land in which we live and where we are. So, we thought we would share some history and fun facts about this island and it's people.

Dominican Republic is on the **island** of **Hispaniola**. The country borders the Atlantic Ocean to the north and the Caribbean Sea in the south. The island is shared with the nation of **Haiti** in the **west** and the **Dominican Republic** on the **Right**.

Christopher Columbus founded the Dominican Republic in 1494. **Our city** named **Puerto Plata** was established in 1502, and got it's name from Columbus when he stood atop the mountains and looked down at the ocean. He said it looked like silver "Port of Silver."

Shortly after its discovery the Indigenous people were dying off which caused the Spanish to quickly grant permission from Spain to use **slaves** to work the plantations. In 1510, the first sizable ship consisted of 250 Black Ladinos (Spanish-speaking Blacks), 8 years later; African born **slaves** were brought here in massive numbers. The start of British involvement in the trans-Atlantic slave trade began in Puerto Plata in 1563, in which 20 million people were forced into slavery.

The island has seen many wars, which divided it into two, Haiti and Dominican. **Race** unfortunately still plays a huge part in this society. There is a lot of prejudge and hatred between the Haitians and the Dominicans.

The flag was designed with color blue is for liberty, red for the blood of heroes, and white for salvation. And it is the only flag in the world with a Bible on it. And the verse John 8:32 "Y la verdad os hara libres"

The Major religion is **Catholic** but most do not attend church. The Dominican Republic's currant populations is 10,882,996. With the **population** here in **Puerto Plata being 118,496**.

The only aerial tramway in the Caribbean is located here in Puerto Plata.

Many tourists visit the island because of its beautiful beaches. In 2015, Carnival Cruise Line opened a cruise port in Puerto Plata.

Baseball is the most popular sport. Many Dominicans have become famous major league players in the United States.

70 percent of the people are affected greatly by **poverty** and unemployment is high.

Prostitution is legal. It is estimated between 60,000 and 100,000 women work as **prostitutes** in the country, many from neighboring Haiti.

Dominicans are very friendly and hospitable people. They are animated and loud. Men shake hands firmly when they greet and close friends embrace. Most women kiss each other on the cheek, and a man who trusts a woman will also kiss her. **So, there's your mini history lesson in a nutshell.**

Ministry continues as usual. It has been a lot of work this month, but also a ton of fun. This past week, our Sunday worship service had 46 people, the most so far!!! Yay!!! 12 were from the states enjoying a vacation; the rest were from the island. But, what excited us the most, and was so amazing, was that a large group of Haitians came. First time ever! Before the service began we noticed a large group just hanging out under our trees. We went out and talked with them and invited them in. They came!! Dominicans and Haitians don't normally worship together because there is such discrimination between these 2 cultures. The Haitian and Dominican hatred is huge, and to have this group feel comfortable enough to come in and worship together with us was awesome! Gloria a Dios! We have been praying for this and God delivered! Will they come again? We don't know, God does. But we will keep praying, keep inviting, and keep sharing the love of Christ with ALL!

For the whole law can be summed up in this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself." Galatians 5:14 (NLT)

Dear Friends, and Family,



As most of you know we established and continued to be a part of Human Resources, Leadership Development and Member Care Team since 2007. We have worked with a wonderful team of godly, passionate, loving, and very capable men and women. A little over two and a half years ago Steve asked to step out of the leadership role to focus more on Member Care. One of our regional leaders took Steve's place. We had also been praying for several years to find a

national leader to fill this position. In January 2019 Ayhan and NeŞe a national couple who we have been friends with since we first came to Turkey, agreed to accept the role. We Praise God for their addition to our team and believe they will lead well.

We have enjoyed encouraging our long-term staff in leadership development and meeting with our short-term teams over the past years. It has been exciting to see them first decide to come overseas, then step out in faith and share the gospel and the love of Christ with those they meet. We will include a photo of one of the groups we debriefed this month.

A year ago, we worked in a new ministry in Antalya with our organization called **Deep Waters**. Staff from our region in Central Asia, Turkey, and a few Expats participated. The desire is to engage with many of our staff leaders who want to



grow deeper in their walks with the Lord. We want them to develop habits for life of listening more to the Lord and not just doing ministry. So each year we will have maybe 10-15 staff taking part in this program. We want them to be more emotionally as well as spiritually healthy. We want to make sure they learn how to take sabbath time to meet with the Lord and ta practice being in our Father's presence not just "doing things "for God. Of course, we all need balance between the two. As we participated in this program last summer the Lord began to tug on our heart strings. We wanted to care for our staff but also longed to be a part of something new. We kept seeking the Lord, while fasting and praying. We also desired

to make more time to share the gospel and disciple others. In Antalya there is an international church plant they want to begin and a couple new Turkish churches which have already begun. We are excited and challenged by the opportunities. It reminds us of the call God first gave us when we came to Turkey. So, we applied to transfer from Istanbul to Antalya.

In May we found a place to live that is more restful with fruit trees, grass and flowers. It is near the sea and a short drive up to the mountains. Our desire is to continue to have a place for family, colleagues, and other friends to come to be refreshed and spend time with the Lord. We moved this past month just in time to renew our residence 2-year permits in Antalya.

We look forward to spending time with some of our new neighbors and new acquaintances in the community. As many of you know this last thirty days Muslims around the world have been praying and fasting for the month and now, they celebrate Eid for 4 days with family and friends. We have already stopped by and visited with some of these neighbors this week. Pray for our times with Abe and Penny. They very friendly.

Please pray for us as we continue to settle into our new home and the work the Lord has for us here. We are entering a new season of life and praying it will be full of sowing, watering and harvesting fruit. May we serve with humility and offer wisdom and guidance to our young staff and young believers in the faith. Pray our marriage would remain strong and reflect how Christ loves the church. Pray that we would be patient and serve each other and enjoy exploring our new community and get more exercise!



Spring 2019

Dear Friends,

Deep Waters with group 2 has been fruitful and fun! This year, we moved the program from Istanbul to Antalya, were we will continue to hold the modules going forward. The number of participants grew from 4 to 11 and included both local and international staff serving in Turkey, Kazakhstan and Kyrgyzstan. The sessions were taught in English and translated into both Turkish and Russian.

We kicked off the summer with a week-long focus on spiritual formation, led by ministry partner Karen Cartmell and spiritual director at Biola University. Later, we heard from <u>Dr. Gary Runn</u>, Executive Director of Strategic Initiatives for Cru. He spoke on the perspective of leadership as servant, shepherd, and steward. Karen Bradley, who served in the area many years and now serves with Christian Embassy in New York, shared in-depth about pain and loss through her own experiences. Other speakers covered topics about character, community, and forgiveness. It was a wonderful month!

At the mid-year week, we were blessed to have <u>Andrea Buczynski</u> and <u>Marc Rutter</u>, global and national directors of Leadership Development for Cru. They taught on the heart of a leader, the importance of boundaries and what kind of leaders are at risk. During the module, we had great discussion times, a panel to hear from area leaders, a talk on sabbath and project presentations.

In May, we wrapped up by synthesizing lessons learned and emphasized the importance of self-leadership, cultivating authentic community and leading change. We heard from licensed counselors Dr. Greg & Anne Fallows and PACT director Dan Kroll. Participants presented their projects to the area leadership, and we celebrated their graduation! In July, Deep Waters will start anew with the next group. There are 13 participants and all are local or national staff from Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan and Turkey. The coaches are from Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Uzbekistan, and the US.

We also have more teammates joining us, and we are raising program funds. It has been a full year, with a lot of new things and transition. But, God has provided at every turn and been our guide. We praise God for all He has done and is doing through DeepWaters! We are grateful for the fruit of the body of Christ serving together.


